All Rights Reserved.): Counting bacteria associated with reef-building corals has been a challenge in the emerging field of coral microbiology, in part due to the overwhelming autofluorescence of the coral holobiont (the coral animal and its symbionts). This laser scanning confocal image (obtained using a Nikon A1R system) of two living polyps from the coral *Pocillopora damicornis* depicts the natural fluorescence resulting from the coral's green fluorescent proteins (GFP; green) and the chlorophyll of the symbiotic dinoflagellates (called zooxanthellae; red).
