GENERAL STATEMENT

APPLIED MICROBIOLOGY is designed for the publication of studies orientated toward the application of microbiological sciences to the fields of industry, foods, sanitation, agriculture, and other areas involving the use or control of microorganisms, with the exception of the microbiological aspects of animal and plant disease. The papers must be concerned primarily with the microbiology or microbiological biochemistry of the processes under consideration or with engineering aspects which influence microbiological processes.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Instructions to authors published in the *Journal of Bacteriology* apply to manuscripts submitted to *Applied Microbiology*, with the following exceptions:

Correspondence—Manuscripts should be submitted in duplicate to H. B. Woodruff, Editor, *Applied Microbiology*, MERCK & CO., Inc., Rahway, N. J. All material should be sent by first class mail in flat form—not folded or rolled. *Applied Microbiology* cannot assume responsibility for manuscripts.

General Policy—Manuscripts are accepted, subject to editorial review, from all who are interested in the field of microbiology. Three classes of articles are published: general scientific articles which report results of original research; Microbiological Process Reports, which are reviews of a particular subject; and Microbiological Process Discussions, which are summaries of an individual author's experiences in a particular field. Authors are asked to limit manuscripts since it may be necessary to charge for space in excess of ten printed pages. Except for good reasons, microorganisms should be designated by the names appearing in *Bergey's Manual of Determinative Bacteriology*, 7th Edition (1957) or Ainsworth & Bisby's *A Dictionary of the Fungi*, 4th Edition (1954), and the rules of nomenclature presented in the *International Code of Nomenclature of Bacteria and Viruses* (1958) should be followed. The name and address of the manufacture must be provided in

footnote form for all products for which a trademark is used.

Reprints—Reprints are not supplied unless ordered and purchased by the author. A table showing cost of reprints and an order slip will be sent with the proof.
